# **Online Meeting**

The **Minutes of the July 10, 2020 meeting of the Board** were unanimously approved, as amended, after a motion by Mickey and a second by Oron.

**Financials:** The financial statement for August, 2020 was presented and approved with no discussion; it is attached to these minutes.

No email motions were made in the interim since the July 11, 2020 meeting of the board.

**Mike Lange – Land acquisition:** The status of the 4,769-acre McNeal tract in Wharton county remains as reported at the 10July20 board meeting. A source for \$678,500 needed for the 50% match requirement for a \$1,357,000 donation by the Knobloch Foundation has yet to be nailed down; the deadline for this offer is January 2022. Mike is still pursuing the Nature Conservancy to act as a bridge lender until other sources can be found.

The situation for the 250-acre Spears Tract remains as reported at the last board meeting.

A **\$10,000,000 Grant** from the Department of Agriculture National Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) **Regional Conservation Partnership Program** may be available to FOBWR and a partner for the pre-purchase discovery work on the conservation of the Columbia Bottomlands. The funds would be issued up front (i.e. this would not be a reimbursement grant). Congressional authorization for this initiative was included in the 2018 Farm Bill. These funds would come from a national \$360 million program and would be disbursed over a five-year period. A match would be needed (details to be determined), but may include funds from other federal agencies (e.g. the Department of Interior) and from NPOs like Houston Endowment. FOBWR essentially would already have the required match.

Our proposal would need to be received by November 1st. Mike noted that our chances of success would be approved by having a partner engaged in land trusts. The Katy Prairie Conservancy will be submitting a grant under this program, so our proposal must differentiate us from this competition. Mike will prepare a draft proposal for review by Lisa and Marty.

The whole process of acquiring the funds would take over two years, with the first year solidifying the partnership and at least a year after that to begin the cash flow.

## Refuge Update – Jennifer -

- The end of the fiscal year is focused on finishing up projects, including the low water crossings on Ivy Road in the SBNWR. This should occur late September.
- The third phase of the \$5.6 million [Ducks Obligation] Resiliency Project on the intracoastal waterway should have engineering and design wrapped up by March 15<sup>th</sup>.

- Tom Schneider reported that DEEP will not resume until winter or spring. Tom is checking with schools to see their interest in at school suitcase sessions.
- October 9<sup>th</sup> is targeted to resume the **Refuge Walks** program. Since typically only about a dozen people participate at a session, SARS Cv19 restrictions should not be a problem.
- Restrooms for **Cannan Bend** should be installed by the end of November. Bids for an electronic gate and a water well have been posted. Trails have been mowed and gravel has been positioned for spreading. The next focus will be on boat ramps and docks.
- The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department are offering conservation grants of up to \$10,000. Toward this end Marty moved and Phil seconded the motion that "The FOBWR board authorizes the submission of a \$10,000 grant request to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Conservation Grant Program for eradication of invasive and planting of native vegetation on the Cannan Bend Unit of the San Bernard National Wildlife Refuge. The board also authorizes the spending of up to \$10,000 from our McGovern reserves to be used as a match to this Conservation Grant." This motion passed unanimously. [Our application was subsequently submitted on 14Sep20.]
- The problem persists with the solar panel inverter that powers the pump for the Discovery Center pond. Jim Payne continues to work with the supplier to get this issue resolved.
- The Houston-Galveston Area Council is offering "Poop Stations" for public areas frequented by dog walkers. Lisa will contact HGAC for getting a station at both Dow Woods and the Bobcat Woods Trail.

## Grants and Project:

Signs and benches for the **Bobcat Woods Trail** have been delivered. Mickey will get with Curtis to select the location for the signs. Two spurs from the boardwalk to the slough remain to be constructed; this will be targeted in the next few weeks when the weather cools. Jennifer will confer with Curtis on progress to get the water well back in operation.

Action Items are listed as an attachment to these minutes. New features are **bolded**. Completed actions are:

• The TPWD has extended our deadline to complete the Bobcat Woods Trail to June 1, 2021.

Administrative Expenses: The board requests that Dick propose a plan to fund FOBWR administrations expenses to be presented before the November board meeting. Per his draft budget for 2020, admin costs would exceed \$10,000; this budget did not include the estimated \$8,000 for an annual audit. [The March, 2020 board minutes further noted major admin expense items.] It was suggested that one source of funds would be to increase dues to \$50 per year. [the draft budget estimated \$500 of dues revenue.] Membership would need to be significantly increased to provide a significant portion of admin expenses.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:42 pm.
